Order:

- 1. Boyer Chrysler Dodge Jeep Ram Ltd. (the "Dealer") shall pay a fine in the amount of \$2,500 no later than ninety (90) calendar days from November 19, 2024.
- 2. Jason James Boyer ("Boyer") shall successfully complete the MVDA Key Elements Course no later than <u>ninety (90) calendar days</u> from November 19, 2024.
- 3. The Dealer shall **offer** to all current and future salespersons, employed by the Dealer, to **fund** their completion of the Automotive Certification Course, no later than <u>ninety (90)</u> calendar days from November 19, 2024.
- 4. The Dealer and Boyer shall comply with the *Motor Vehicle Dealers Act, 2002*, O. Reg. 333/08, O. Reg. 332/08 and its Code of Ethics, and the Standards of Business Practice.

Overview

This matter proceeded on the basis of an Agreed Statement of Facts, dated July 12, 2024, a Joint Submission on Penalty and a waiver of oral hearing, pursuant to Rule 1.07 of the Rules of Practice before the Discipline Tribunal and the Appeals Tribunal. The Agreed Statement of Facts states in relevant part as follows:

Amendment:

1. The Notice of Complaint dated February 29, 2024 is amended to reflect that the Ontario Motor Vehicle Industry Council ("OMVIC") replaces the Registrar, *Motor Vehicle Dealers Act*, 2002 as a party to this proceeding.

Background:

- 2. Boyer Chrysler Dodge Jeep Ram Ltd. (the "Dealer") was first registered as a motor vehicle dealer in and around February 2016.
- 3. Jason James Boyer ("Boyer") was first registered as a salesperson in and around May 1996. At all material times, Boyer has been a General Manager and the Person in Charge of the day-to-day activities of the Dealer.

OMVIC Publications:

4. Since the Act was proclaimed in 2010, OMVIC has issued various educational materials, including publications, webinars and guidelines, reminding registrants of their all-in pricing obligations. The dates of said publications are attached hereto as Schedule "A". Educational materials continue to be available on OMVIC's website.

Prior OMVIC Communications:

5. On or about January 7, 2020, in response to a consumer complaint, a representative of the Registrar sent an email to Boyer to remind him of the Dealer's all-in pricing obligations pursuant to section 36 of O. Reg. 333/08.

Dealer's Non-Compliance:

- 6. On or before April 20, 2023, the Dealer published an advertisement for a 2022 Ram 1500 Classic Night Edition, stock# PL22080 (VIN# **********188214) with an advertised price of \$47,995 plus taxes and licensing.
- 7. On or about the same date, an OMVIC Representative made inquires about the vehicle, while posing as a member of the public.
- 8. A salesperson, acting on behalf of the Dealer, provided the OMVIC Representative with a worksheet for the vehicle. An additional charge of \$717 for "options & fees" was added to the advertised price of the vehicle.
- 9. As such, the Dealer's advertised vehicle price was not all-inclusive. This is contrary to section 36(7) of O. Reg. 333/08, as well as sections 4(2) and 9(3) of the Code of Ethics.

Boyer's Non-Compliance:

- 10. Boyer failed to ensure that the Dealer conducted its business in compliance with the Act, its regulations, and the Code of Ethics and thus personally contravened sections 6(2) and 9(3) of the Code of Ethics.
- 11. As particularized above, the Dealer has violated the following section of the Code of Ethics:

Disclosure and marketing

- s. 4(2) A registrant shall ensure that all representations, including advertising, made by or on behalf of the registrant in connection with trading in motor vehicles, are legal, decent, ethical and truthful.
- 12. As particularized above, the Dealer and Boyer have violated the following section of the Code of Ethics:

Professionalism

- s. 9(3) A registrant shall use the registrant's best efforts to prevent error, misrepresentation, fraud or any unethical practice in respect of a trade in a motor vehicle.
- 13. As particularized above, Boyer has violated the following section of the Code of Ethics:

Accountability

s. 6(2) A registered salesperson shall not do or omit to do anything that causes the registered motor vehicle dealer who employs or retains the salesperson to contravene this Regulation or any applicable law with respect to trading in motor vehicles.

Decision of the Reviewing Panel

Having reviewed and considered the Agreed Statement of Facts and written submissions provided by the Parties, the Reviewing Panel is satisfied that the evidence contained in the Agreed Statement of Facts substantiates the allegations that: (1) the Dealer has breached subsections 4(2) and 9(3) of the OMVIC Code of Ethics; (2) Boyer has breached subsections 6(2) and 9(3) of the OMVIC Code of Ethics.

The Reviewing Panel accepted the Joint Submission on Penalty for the reasons that follow.

Reasons for Decision

The evidence and submissions filed left the Reviewing Panel with no concerns that the disposition proposed by the Parties may be contrary to the public interest. The Reviewing Panel accordingly granted the order requested.
