NOTICE OF REFERRAL TO DISCIPLINE TRIBUNAL

Take notice that pursuant to section 14(4) 4 of the *Motor Vehicle Dealers Act, 2002*, (the "Act"), the Registrar has referred the complaint(s) against 1187535 Ontario Inc. o/a G & G Auto and Jiri Gregor to the Discipline Tribunal for alleged violations under the Code of Ethics, as set out in Ontario Regulation 332/08.

REASONS

Section 17 of the Act establishes a Discipline Tribunal and empowers the Discipline Tribunal to hear and determine issues concerning alleged breaches of the Code of Ethics. The Code of Ethics applies to all Registrants registered under the Act. Any Registrants that disregard or violate the Code of Ethics are subject to having their conduct reviewed by the Discipline Tribunal. The Code of Ethics requires that all Registrants conduct business with Integrity, Accountability, Compliance, Respect and Professionalism as well as ensuring that requirements are met when it comes to Disclosure and Marketing and the Disclosure of Information in Sale and Lease Contracts.

PARTICULARS

The reasons for this Notice are:

Background

1. 1187535 Ontario Inc. o/a G & G Auto (the "Dealer") was first registered as a motor vehicle dealer under the Act on or about September 5, 2007.

2. Jiri Gregor, also known as George ("Gregor"), was first registered as a salesperson under the Act on or about May 9, 1995. At all material times, Gregor has been an Officer and Person in Charge of the day-to-day activities of the Dealer.
3. On or about September 5, 2007, Gregor executed terms and conditions of registration on behalf of the Dealer. Per condition 6, the Dealer agreed to comply with the Code of Ethics. Per condition 20, the Dealer agreed to provide written disclosure, on the bill of sale, of all material facts about the vehicles it sells or leases.

Educational Resources

4. Since the Act was proclaimed in 2010, OMVIC has issued various educational materials, including publications, webinars and guidelines, reminding registrants of their obligations to disclose all material facts about the vehicles they sell. The dates of said publications are attached hereto as Schedule "A". Educational resources continue to be available on OMVIC's website.

Reminders to Comply

5. During an inspection on or about February 24, 2020, a representative of the Registrar reminded the Dealer to disclose in writing on a bill of sale, all material facts including but not limited to, a vehicle's previous registration in another jurisdiction, pursuant to section 42 of O. Reg. 333/08 and the Code of Ethics.
6. During an inspection on or about November 20, 2024, a representative of the Registrar further reminded the Dealer to disclose in writing on a bill of sale, all material facts including but not limited to, a vehicle's previous registration in another jurisdiction, pursuant to section 42 of O. Reg. 333/08 and the Code of Ethics.

Dealer's Non-Compliance

7. On or about October 10, 2025, the Dealer purchased a 2013 Toyota Avalon (VIN # *2890) from an individual. The bill of sale disclosed that the vehicle had previously been registered in the province of Quebec.
8. On or about October 16, 2025, the Dealer sold this vehicle to a consumer (the "Consumer"). The Dealer failed to disclose on the retail bill of sale ("RBOS") that the vehicle had previously been registered in Quebec, contrary to section 42(22) of O. Reg. 333/08.
9. On or about December 11, 2025, the Consumer filed a complaint with a representative of the Registrar (the "Representative") regarding the Dealer. The Consumer stated that he became aware of the vehicle's out of province registration only after the date of purchase.
10. From December 2025 to April 2026, the Representative attempted to facilitate a resolution between the Consumer and the Dealer. Ultimately the Dealer was unable to resolve the complaint in a manner which was acceptable to the Consumer.

11. By failing to disclose on the RBOS that the vehicle had previously been registered in Quebec, the Dealer has contravened section 42(22) of O. Reg. 333/08, sections 7(1) and 9(1) and (3) of the Code of Ethics, as well as conditions 6 and 20 of its registration.

Gregor's Non-Compliance

12. Gregor, as a Person in Charge, failed to ensure that the Dealer conducted its business in compliance with the Act, its regulations, and the Code of Ethics and thus personally contravened sections 6(2) and 9(1) and (3) of the Code of Ethics.

The Registrant(s) may provide a written response to the particulars set out above to OMVIC within 15 days of service of this Notice to: legal_dept@omvic.on.ca

If the Discipline Tribunal makes a determination that a registrant has failed to comply with the Code of Ethics, it may order one or more of the following:

- A fine up to \$25,000 per party;
- Require the registrant to take further educational courses;
- If the registrant is a motor vehicle dealer, require the dealer to arrange and fund educational courses for salespersons employed by the dealer;
- Award costs.

This Notice of Referral to Discipline ("NORD") and decisions of the Discipline Tribunal may be published. Hearings before the Discipline Tribunal may be recorded and are open to the public.

The *Statutory Powers Procedure Act, R.S.O 1990 c.s.22*, applies to the hearing to be held by this Discipline Tribunal. A party to a proceeding may be represented by counsel or an agent.

The good character, propriety of conduct or competence of the Registrant(s) shall be an issue in any hearing before the Discipline Tribunal and reasonable information of allegations with respect thereto has been furnished.

The Rules of Practice of the Discipline Tribunal will apply and are available on OMVIC's website. A Notice of Hearing and disclosure will be provided in accordance with the Rules of Practice of the Discipline Tribunal.

Take note that as per the Rules of Practice, failure to attend a hearing before the Discipline Tribunal may result in a decision being determined *ex parte* (in your absence).

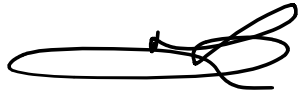
APPLICATION OF THE RULES OF PRACTICE OF THE DISCIPLINE TRIBUNAL
